Dear Parents & Carers,

We appreciate this is a challenging time for you and the children and, as a school, we want to make sure we are as prepared as possible during this period. As teachers, we have met together to decide on how best to support the children in their learning while they are out of school. Fortunately, the children already have accounts for several online learning formats – we have provided up-to-date log-in on the hard copy sent home to the children. A list of useful website can be found below.

In addition, we have set up a personal Google Classroom account for each child. Through this log-in, they will be able to access a variety of learning challenges, set by the teachers.

It is important to note, that for your child to log in to their Google Classroom, they will need to use the Chrome browser on your device/computer and log in using the details provided by staff. From here, they will be able to access the Google classroom using the link below.

We understand that not every child will have access to online learning at home. As a result, we have included ideas on how children can continue their learning, independently, at home. Each Class Teacher has created a bespoke plan for their class, which links to current curriculum learning.

Finally, we would also encourage children to continue reading widely and frequently as this links into so many other areas of the curriculum.

Each child will be sent home with an exercise book and a pencil for their home learning. New learning challenges and worksheets will be updated fortnightly.

Record your observations in an artistic and creative way with drawings and writing to monitor how the weather changes as we move from Winter to Spring</p>	<p>English Write a newspaper report. You can write a report of your choice or you can watch BBC Newsround and take notes, then write a report. Or you can take a headline from an existing newspaper but write your own report.</p>
<p>Reading Write a book review. What is it about? (no spoilers!) Think about why you would recommend it. Who would enjoy it? Marks out of 5.</p>	<p><u>Learning Steps:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Headline using a pun, alliteration or rhyme - Introductory paragraph - Third person - Direct and reported speech - Past tense - Pictures have captions
<p>Design and Technology Make a meal together</p>	<p>RE Find out about a different place of worship, other than a church e.g. a mosque, gurdwara, synagogue or mandir. Draw it and label things you might find inside.</p>
<p>Science Set up a forces investigation. Here are some ideas: Which object falls the fastest? How can I make my paper aeroplane fly further? Which material makes the best parachute?</p>	<p>P.E Design your own game to be played by the class when we return to school. You must include the aim of the game, rules and equipment needed.</p>
<p>Art Create a sketch or piece of art based on your hands. Think about drawing it in different positions, the shading, colour and texture of your hands.</p>
